

**Arizona State University-Southwest Poll  
Frequency Questionnaire  
(n=1,013)**

The *Arizona State University-Southwest Poll* was conducted by telephone from November 6 - December 19, 2007 by the Institute for Social Science Research at Arizona State University. The poll was conducted among a random sample of 1,013 adult residents in the Southwest United States. The results from the full survey have a margin of sampling error of plus or minus three percentage points.
